- ❖ Welcome address by Dr Shankar Prasad Sharma: He welcomed all the guests, students, researchers academicians, the local public, donors and media persons. - ❖ In a short brief the honorable Pro Vice Chancellor Prof CS Chaudhary said that Indian culture shows about unity in diversity and we are the country of joint family we are the country of the rural life style and we should learn from our indigenous way of life to become a better person. He also talked about the institutional and the development issues that are to be taken care of so that the college could work better and develop better. ## Report:

- ❖ Prof. Diwakar Pandey in his address talked on Bhojpuri language and the richness of Bhojpuri with its proximity to Sanskrit and how we have done a lot of damage in our language and culture.
- ❖ Kumar Mangal Singh stressed on the need for tourism planning. Tourism Planning helps in problem solving and arriving at decisions which help planners in achieving desired objectives. Planning for tourism is very crucial. Several countries of the world, especially the developing countries have lately realized the importance of tourism and benefits which it brings out. The use of macroeconomic planning techniques for the tourism sector are relatively new. The use of macroeconomic planning methods for national economic development which have been largely utilized since the end of World War II, did not always cover tourism development as a particular field. The increasing significance of tourism as a source of income, employment generation, regional development, foreign exchange and a major factor in the balance of payments for many countries has been attracting the attention of many governments as well as others with an interest in economic development.
- ❖ Arjun Prasad discussed that in Bihar, there is cut-throat competition in the service industry and to sustain in the competition, Bihar and its organizations must utilize their human assets in a right direction and for this the new human resource practices have become very vital for business survival. Employee engagement is the latest human resource practice which has been implemented by each and every organization. By engaging employees toward the jobs, organizations increase their performance as well as profit. The tourism industry is one of the industries where Bihar needs to work because it is growing very rapidly and generates employment for the local people at a large scale.
- ❖ Sushmita Bharti asserted the perception of COVID-19 among tourists. It has influenced intentions and motivation in the tourism sector, changing travel behaviour. The mental health consequences of travel have been replaced by widely recognised fear and anxiety. Nonetheless, there are several reasons to travel during the pandemic.
- ❖ Priyanka Raj in her study discussed about the occupational stress of tourism employees of Bihar state. Her research was based on a sample of 60 employees of the tourism sector. The data was collected with the help of an occupational stress scale through incidental sampling technique. The

results of this study shows that they are facing high occupational stress which is not good for their physical as well as their mental health.

- ❖ Raj Aman research was to investigate how spiritual retreat tourism influenced tourist satisfaction related to adjustment and intention to revisit in the Mundeshwari temple, Bhabua. The results revealed that push factor including novelty, relaxation, transcendence, self-esteem, physical appearance and escape influence spiritual retreat tourist satisfaction; while pull factors, especially authentic experiences, natural settings, peaceful atmosphere, far from the usual places and historical significance, influence spiritual retreat tourist satisfaction, in turn leading to intention to revisit the same destination.
- ❖ Vijaylakshmi expressed her view that the poets, writers, literacy people, academicians, researchers and religious saints should contribute by writing and making people aware of our rich cultural heritage. They should also give theoretical input on the subject.
- ❖ Abhilasha Sharma stressed on the role of ghats along the river Ganga in tourism and also to identify the projects near the Ganga River promoting tourism in Varanasi.
- ❖ Dr Annapurna Gupta showed by the PPT slide a comparison of dissemination of preservation of cultural heritage mundeshwari temple and Sun temple in Konark. In her psychological review she beautifully explained about religion about meditation and how the mundeshwari temple is different from Konark temple of the Konark Sun temple.
- ❖ Dr. Sanjay Kumar Explained That Bihar and Biharies have tried to maintain their ancient culture, tradition and rituals for long time. Unfortunately, during British rule, English system had strongly hammered over these rituals, norms, culture etc. After Independence, we are still trying to establish these features in the society. Each and every district has rich and distinct variety of culture and traditions. It has some strong aspects, weak aspects, opportunities and challenges or threat. So, it is the need of the hour/ time to conserve these rituals, culture, beliefs and norms. The five C's is essential i.e Credibility, Conservation, Communication, Capacity building and Communities for the preservation of rich cultural tradition and heritage of Bihar.
- ❖ Dr. Mukesh Kumar said that an integrated education strategy is essential today to express the value of cultural heritage. Government should organize cultural awareness programmes; promote a curriculum that includes cultural knowledge. They should protect and preserve the cultural sites, literature, language and heritage. Social media connect people across space and time and allowing

them to find like-minded communities and participate creatively in public life as never before. Moreover, social media promote the interconnectedness and interdependence of our culturally diverse world.

- ❖ Sarah Ahmad presented paper on the muslim shrine ‘*Dargah*’. Unlike the normative pilgrimage site in Islam like *Al-Haramin* Saudi Arabia, *Dargah*’s are visited by people of all religious backgrounds. In the present world which is more divided than ever, these shrines represent a symbol of unity and religious harmony. Unfortunately *Dargahs* are going through a phase of radicalization. As a basis for understanding the sense of place in the context of Muslim religious-heritage context, this study attempts to develop a conceptual model for knowing the people-place bonding and the continuing nature of this religious and sacred heritage despite the existing religious antagonism
- ❖ Amrita Kumari explained the significance of Buxar town in Bihar as a historical heritage and rich culture. The city is largely influenced by Bhojpuri culture and Bhojpuri is the major local language of the area. The city has seen the famous battles and stills standing in Buxar are the remains of the past telling the stories of the vast history. The people of Buxar are not very modernized and are rooted to their traditions and culture. In Buxar district, there are many famous tourist places. Among them, Brahmeshwarnath Temple, Katkauli ka maidan, Sita Ram Upadhyaya Museum, Chousa hoard, Buxar fort, Bihariji Temple are major tourist sites. Branmeshwarnath Temple is a revered place in the region, which is also referred to as Baba Brahmeshwarnath Dham. Katkauli ka Maidan is situated on the out skirts of Buxar. Sita Ram Upadhyaya Museum was opened in 1979.
- ❖ Amit Kumar Sharma gave his presentation on tourism and development. According to him, the development thoughts are to be converted into action
- ❖ Dr Brijraj Prasad Gupta gave a lot of examples from Kaimur in the name of mundeshwari temple, Telhar kund, Harsu Brahm, Durgavati, Bakhtiyar Khilji makbara, etc. In around Kaimur. He stressed on the economic aspects. Economic conditions of the areas must be developed.
- ❖ Dr Shiv Kumar Rabidas stressed on rural tourism in Bihar. It has a huge potential to flourish as a socioeconomic endeavor that supports the preservation and promotion of rural biodiversity, which will be essential to the state's sustainable development. However, this dream can only come true if the issue of rural tourism is treated as an innovative strategic marketing endeavour by the business

community. Government initiatives must back this up if the rural tourism sector is to grow and rural tourism entrepreneurs are to succeed. Modern hotels, motels, rest stops, youth hostels, and restaurants have been created in the nation to make the greatest use of the natural gift. Modern communication methods are also accessible at all tourist destinations. Near the state's tourist attractions, Bihar needs to construct lodging, restaurants, a good communication and transit system, restrooms, parking, and other amenities. All of Bihar's tourist destinations need to be upgraded to international standards; however COVID-19 has altered this industry.

- ❖ Amit Kumar Pandey presented his paper on Bodh Gaya. It is believed to be the place where the historical Buddha Shakyamuni (Siddhartha Gautama) attained enlightenment situated with in the region of northeastern India historical known as Magadh, Bodh Gaya and others nearby site witnessed Buddhist activity from atleast the 1st century BCE that significantly diminished only in the 13th century. An early focus of worship at Bodh Gaya Seems To Have Been The BODHI TREE And The Seat Beneath It, Often Called The VAJRASANA. Here, After Meditating Through The Night, Shakyamuni Reached Profound Understanding Of The Way Things Really Are (An Understanding Of The Concept Known As PRATITYA SAMUTPADA), Thus Becoming A Buddha. Eventually a temple was built there called the Mahabodhi Temple. It is a religious site and place of pilgrimage with the Mahabodhi Temple. Many other monuments were added over the centuries, reflecting extensive religious patronage and practice.
- ❖ Jyoti Kumari explained the heritage tourism in India. She said that India heritage tour will never be monotonous for a tourist as insights on India's artforms and music, folktales, cuisines pilgrimage places, magnificent monuments. Numerous national parks and forests. Everything has a story to tell. There will never be a dull moment in your life in India as India's heritage and cultural tourism is so vast and interesting.
- ❖ Priti Kumari said that heritage tourism is an activity with a long history that, can be measured in centuries if not millennia. Heritage tourism includes:- Historic buildings and monuments, sites of important past events like battles traditional landscapes and indigenous wildlife, language, literature, music and art,traditional lifestyles including food,drink and sport.

### Report

- ❖ Chandra Prakash Mahto talked on Brick industry as an unorganized industry, workers working in this industry facing seasonal migration. The paper mainly highlights the economic and social condition of the workers working in this industry. Also it throw the light on how seasonal migration uncertain the workers livelihood.
- ❖ Sandhya Kumari presented her paper on yoga tourism, there is still a paucity of studies on the subject, especially regarding its socio-cultural and psychological impacts. Yoga tourism is travel with the specific purpose of experiencing some form of yoga, whether psychological, spiritual or postural. The former is a type of spiritual tourism; the latter is related both to spiritual and to physical-mental wellness tourism and it also reduced stress and depression.
- ❖ Nidhi Nandinee studied the impact of microfinance on sociocultural and economic scenario changes of the poor in Bihar state. She emphasized on the different schemes and opportunities provided by the national and state governments of Bihar that eventually help in breaking the vicious circle of poverty by overcoming the social and economical poverty of poor people in Bihar.
- ❖ Sulochna Kumari explained how the social culture has a unique contribution in the language development, social development, mental development, religious development, character and moral development of children.

- ❖ Akhilesh Prasad discussed on the Intimate partner violence (IPV) as a global health concern and a violation of fundamental human rights. Very little has been said on how socioeconomic inequality may affect IPV. The goal of the study is to investigate how socioeconomic inequality affects IPV in India. Interventions to empower women would not only increase women's access to economic opportunities and services, but they should also work with men and women to address male gender stereotypes, masculinity standards, and men's livelihoods.
- ❖ Dr. Prashant Kumar talked on the rich heritage legacy of Indian cities, but they are being vastly undervalued and underutilized for contemporary social, ecological and economic development. In this sense, the Government of India launched the HRIDAY Scheme that envisaged to help developing cities' heritage and culture to preserve and revitalize their identity. The paper has been built on an extensive literature review which identify a set of indicators associated with the revitalization process of traditional cultural cities.
- ❖ Vishal Prakash explained how the scheduled castes are the most deprived communities and are treated by society as untouchables and placed at the bottom of society due to the prevalent caste system in India. Because of their poverty, low economic and social conditions, low educational status, high rate of unemployment, lack of agricultural land, and lack of active political involvement, they live in socially and economically disadvantaged societies. The objective has been pursued throughout the research: to study the socioeconomic status of the scheduled caste population in the Basti District of Uttar Pradesh.
- ❖ Abhay Kumar stressed on the socio-cultural changes that are the alterations witnessed in the behaviour, beliefs, and practices of society. With the government's attention and focus on sensitive issues through multiple campaigns like Swatch Bharat, Skill India, Make in India, etc., things are taking a better shape, still, there are miles to go before our country could be considered as 'Ideal India'.
- ❖ Anil Kumar examines sociocultural perspective as a new paradigm in the poems of JeetThayil, which appears to be more meaningful and relevant to the contemporary times. Jeet won Sahitya Akademi award for English for his poetic collection 'These errors Are Correct' in 2012. Through his works he projects the spiritual bankruptcy, aridity and the barrenness of human life in the post independence era in India.
- ❖ Kumari Vandana discussed about the use of science and technology and its impact on agriculture. Especially in Bihar and its economy.

- ❖ Rajesh Kumar described the success and prospects of Mukhyamantri Udyami Yojana scheme in Barh sub-division of Patna district. He discussed about the prospects of agro based industries and generation of employment in the area.
- ❖ Sourabh Kumar focused on the progress and problems of primary education in a descriptive way. The study revealed that primary schooling increases labour productivity in both urban and rural sector, and economic returns to such investments are high. In addition, it reduces fertility, improves health and nutrition, and promotes other behaviour and attitudinal changes which are helpful to economic development.
- ❖ Rakesh Prakash discussed how India and its people are undergoing tremendous change at the hands of the digital age specially in terms of banking which has long been dominated by conventional methods and practices. The paper describes the evolution of e banking during COVID-19 and its current status, and future opportunities and challenges.
- ❖ Dr. Kaushledra Jha discussed the Impact on socio-cultural perspectives to the learning system of college level students. The aim of the paper is to weave together some of Vygotsky's key ideas with pressing, contemporary concerns, particularly the need to shape educational institutions to deliver instruction which meets the needs of all students,
- ❖ Tripti Raksha discussed the role of The role of JIVIKA Didi's in changing the socio-cultural and economic scenario of the rural community in Bihar. The research concludes that the JEEVIKA DIDIs are effective agents to change society's socio-cultural and economic status.
- ❖ Gaurav Paswan highlight the role of MSMEs in the socio-economic development of Bihar. The paper concludes that it created job opportunities at a large scale for rural and urban people and made a spectacular contribution to the Bihar economy by reducing regional inequities, promoting equitable economic growth, and increasing the country's export potential.
- ❖ Anshu Kumar discussed the role of Indigenous people's identity, culture, languages, traditions, and means of subsistence in cultural advancement and the preservation of heritage. The paper also mentions that these are rooted in traditional knowledge and must be safeguarded, conserved, and promoted.
- ❖ Shailendra Kumar reviewed the impact and effectiveness in implementation of Mahatma Gandhi National Rural Employment Guarantee Act at state level as well as village level with focus on



inclusiveness rural labor market and Agriculture. He concludes that towards the attainment of the women employment generation at household and community level in the rural areas MANREGA is a great milestone.

- ❖ Kumkum Kumari described the socio cultural revival during the Indian National Movement. The paper also discussed the role of Swami Vivekanand, Dayanand Saraswati, Arbindo Ghosh in building one nation and realizing the concept of unity in diversity.
- ❖ Hajra Kulsoom discussed the similarities in every aspect of life like art, culture, architecture, language, traditions and religion between India and Iran. The paper described how Iranian culture influenced Indian culture and vice versa. She also provided evidences from ancient scriptures such as Vedas, Avesta and many others.
- ❖ Nazir Hasan explores the major beliefs and customs of the Indian people throughout the nineteenth century as they are portrayed in Amitav Ghosh's novel Sea of Poppies. He discussed the two major events of The first Opium War in India and the Golden Triangle Trade between China and Britain, as well as the massive migration of farmers to the agricultural lands of the British colonies. Through this he highlighted the social circumstances of the era as well as the status of women in a male- dominated culture.
- ❖ Anil Kumar Mandal have systematized and studied in critical terms, a range of Alice Munro mainly women-centric short stories, with an in-depth study of their living condition under the traditional social conventions. In her work she explains how Munro explores women's role in different situation of life as a young girl, career women, a lover, wife or mother. In each of these roles Canadian women found a reflection of their selves mirrored in Munro's chronical of women's social history down the decades.
- ❖ Bhavana Gupta described the socio-cultural and economic scenario of Rewa city. She discussed the role of culture in social and economic development and highlighted the influence of modernization and urbanization on the loss of ancient culture.
- ❖ Dr. Sailesh Kumar discussed the socio economic challenges in implementation to MGNREGA. He also analysed the socio-economic condition of rural workers in India.
- ❖ Dr. Nutan Kumari presented an Indian instance of the socio-cultural impact of sexual behaviour and sexual offences. She described how the Kama Sutra of Vatsyayana, an epic on sex, is the

source of Indian society's sexual culture and that many of the behaviours it describes are illegal under current law but is revered and accepted culturally.

- ❖ Rakesh Prakash discussed the challenges and opportunities of e- banking services in Bihar during COVID 19 outbreak. He also described how it empowered people but remained a problem for rural poor at the same time.
- ❖ Sanjeet Kumar objectively analysed the multicollinearity between commuting tourist and socio-economic development from heritage and cultural vibrant with primary and secondary data with the help of qualitative and quantitative enquiry of variables likes: Source of Income, Employment, social empowerment, cultural wealth etc.
- ❖ Bhaskar Kumar attempted to determine whether social support, mental health, and personality all play a role in the relationship between socioeconomic level and self-esteem among adolescents. The Rosenberg Self-Esteem Scale, the Family Affluence Scale, the Ten-Item Personality Inventory, the 12-Item General Health Questionnaire, and the Perceived Social Support Scale were completed by a sample of 1000 elementary school kids from Bihar (mean age = 14.3 years, 49% boys). The findings suggest that personality traits and mental health subscales have a role in the relationship between family wealth and self-esteem.
- ❖ Sourabh Kumar focused on the progress and problems of primary education in a descriptive way. The study revealed that primary schooling increases labour productivity in both urban and rural sector, and economic returns to such investments are high. In addition, it reduces fertility, improves health and nutrition, and promotes other behaviour and attitudinal changes which are helpful to economic development.

### Report:

- ❖ Ujjawal Kumar in his address talked on the level of Motivation among the male and female employees of Public and Private Sectors. The results reported that there is a significant difference in the level of motivation among the male and female employees. Female employees have demonstrated less motivation in comparison with male employees.
- ❖ Nitika kumari stressed on the need to examine current research on job satisfaction in the hospitality and tourist industries. The elements that affect an individuals ability to be satisfied at work were further divided into four categories: organisational, individual, social and familial, and psychological. In-depth research was done on job satisfaction for this study, which also built a comprehensive picture of job satisfaction based on its causes, outcomes, research goal.
- ❖ Kanu Priya discussed about performance in tourism entrepreneurship and gender effects. It was revealed that a favourable relationship between place identity ,or ones's sense of belonging to their home town ,and entrepreneurial self efficacy .
- ❖ Anupriya Anand talked about role of Indian culture in child development . Every child is grown in different environment with different culture and tradition consequently it effects their development be it social or cultural .
- ❖ Dr Khushbu discussed about Women Empowerment in the new economic environment of new India and role of ITC . The revolution in information and communication technology (ICT) has not only created new opportunities for economic growth and social development, but it has also created problems and challenges.

- ❖ Neha's research was to investigate the impact of Yoga-nidra on depression of college going students .Yoga-Nidra is a traditional Indian technique and used to heal mental and physical health issues. Yoga-nidra in modern usage is a state of consciousness between waking and sleeping, typically induced by a circular guided healing medita
- ❖ Lala Kumar expressed his view to understand the role of Yoga into Inter-personal Relationship and to find the mechanism to develop it through Yogic practices.
- ❖ Dharmendra Kumar stressed on Effective intervention strategies for ADHD children in the classroom. ADHD is a common neurodevelopmental disorders, which is usually diagnosed in childhood and often lasts into adulthood. Most successful interventions are a combination of classroom supports and strategies taught directly to students to help them become more academically and behaviorally successful.
- ❖ Mantosh kumar elaborated about Adjustment and Emotional Maturity among First Year College Students. He compared college adjustment processes and emotional maturity between first and final year female students enrolled in different undergraduate courses offered by colleges affiliated with University of Ara in Buxar city .
- ❖ Dr Rani Ranjan Sah compared the level of achievement motivation of women comes from urban and rural background . Result has shown that urban background gives more facilities to women to grow or success. The conclusion of the research is that urban social background is one of a factor to enhance the motive to achieve
- ❖ Sourav Kumar Explained Socio economic empowerment of women through MSME in Bhojpur District of Bihar . MSME play vital role in the economic and social development .
- ❖ Syeda Rabab Fatma discussed women empowerment through decision making . Empowerment of women means developing women as more aware individuals who are politically active, economically productive and independent and can make intelligent discussion in matters that affect women.
- ❖ Shree Prasad Das discussed about Stakeholders- Policy makers, Common People and Others. To keep stakeholders happy, the Policy Maker builds trust among project stakeholders with their Strategic Management and strengthens their procurement or positive collaboration.
- ❖ Satendra Kumar Raman talked about role of labour union in nation building after independence in India. India has seen numerous unions come together to solve a shared concern since gaining

independence. These include the devastating 1974 rail strike and the 1982 Great Bombay textile strike. After 1991, however, it appears that the public supports such strikes less. Also receiving more attention is informal labour. This is because unorganised labour is in such a vulnerable position. The unorganised sector has seen an upsurge in membership at all major labour unions.

- ❖ Kumari Vineeta discussed about generational diversity examines involvement at work, organisational commitment, professional commitment, and team commitment . Her Findings suggests that there is a decrease in job involvement, affective organizational commitment, normative organizational commitment, and increase in professional commitment in young generations.
- ❖ Sanni kumar Verma explained about the attitudes and life satisfaction of the youth and the elderly about social change. His findings that the differences between the elderly persons and the youth conflicts between ideologies and beliefs promote social and family distancing. Therefore, to bridge this gap, people of both classes need to have flexibility in their attitude and behavior. The youth should also do some work while appreciating the feelings of the elderly.
- ❖ Saurabh suman research was on increasing role of women in administration and change in their social and economic status . His findings suggests that in this era of modernisation womens have been empowered because of their increasing role in administration and subsequently their social and economic status changed .
- ❖ Vibha kumari discussed about cultural heritage and its teachings .She elaborated the concept of culture and its correlations with human civilization .
- ❖ Surya prakash talked on changing nature of public policy in 21st century .His findings suggest that gradually people have been empowered because of changing nature of policies like RTI etc .
- ❖ Neeta Maurya explained about sociological study of rural youths in family environment . Family environment plays very vital role in the sociological development of child in rural areas.
- ❖ Arti kumari research was on working womens and their struggle in social ,economic and cultural life .
- ❖ Narenrdra Bharti expressed his views about the role and effects of regional parties on national policies.Regional parties play important role in decision making process of local areas .
- ❖ Dr Punam kumari talked on the human thoughts of Radhakrishnan .She also explained physical and spiritual aspects of human life .

- ❖ Dr. Sarita Kumari in her paper discussed several issues concerning the preservation and conservation of India's intangible cultural heritage and stated the importance of oral traditions, aesthetic and religious beliefs, rituals and festivals, arts, music, folk traditions, dances, theatre forms, performing arts, and narrative storytelling styles in our life.
- ❖ Shweta Srivastava evaluated the impacts of rapid urbanization, immense vehicular aggregation and a myriad of large scale construction projects on heritage sites of Lucknow city. She also suggested precautionary and preventive measures for the aforementioned problem.
- ❖ Kumar Nirbhay discussed about the problems of unplanned urbanization in the region and its associated problems. He also attempted to figure out the problems in the conservation of cultural heritage of the region arising due to unplanned urbanization.
- ❖ Vivek Kumar discussed about the problems of preserving the rich cultural heritage of India and tourism development together.

- ❖ Prof. Shivparsan Singh discussed the impact of globalization on India's culture and stressed on the importance of preservation of India's rich culture by maintaining the way of life as we did in the past while reaping the benefits of globalization.
- ❖ Indu Kumari discussed the impact of globalization on cultural diversity of India. The diversity in food and festivals depicts the cultural diversity in India which according to the scholar has been modified by modern food habits and migration due to socio-economic reasons.
- ❖ Govind Kumar Pathak gave a detailed description of various cultural aspects that makes Bihar stand out and has its own cultural identity. He has also mentioned about the role of historical educational centers that nurtured the culture of Bihar.
- ❖ Anil kr. Sharma discussed the role of literacy in preservation of cultural heritage of Bihar. The paper distinguished the perception about the cultural heritage and its importance of preservation among literates and illiterates in Jagdishpur, Bihar.
- ❖ Devendra Kumar Singh described the performance of MANREGA programme and evaluated its success and failures. He also suggested changes in the programme to make it more suitable and beneficial to rural young population.
- ❖ Ankit Dayal discussed the role of schools and its teachers in imparting knowledge of the rich cultural heritage of India. He also stressed on creating awareness regarding preservation of cultural heritage among children through school curriculum.
- ❖ Dr. Veena Kumari described how textile industry has changed its ways of production and quality with changing time. She also discussed the influence of modernization and westernization on the patterns of clothing that has changed and lost the essence of culture.
- ❖ Ranjit Bahadur Singh described the culture of Bihar in terms of language, food, festivals and way of living. The paper also discusses how it has changed through time with changing patterns of education which was nurtured by the historical educational centers.
- ❖ Sanjeev Kumar described the culture of Buxar district in historical context and mentioned the role of society and specially family as a unit of society in preserving the culture of the region. He emphasized the importance of Buxar as a significant religious place which can become a basis for the development of tourism in the area.

- ❖ Dr. Abhishek Kumar described the performance of Rural Development programmes and evaluated its success and failures. He also suggested changes in the programmes and policies towards the benefits to rural population.
- ❖ Surendra Kr. Pandit discussed the role of cleanliness in maintaining and preserving our cultural heritage. He emphasized the importance of maintaining the tangible cultural heritage such as monuments for our future generations to come. - ❖ Kiran Kumari Singh discussed about the protection of cultural heritage sites as a development goal to generate tourism-based jobs and promote local culture, tradition, history and identity. In addition, the United Nations Educational, Scientific and Cultural Organization (UNESCO) and the United Nations (UN) Sustainable Development Goals by the United Nations (UN) seek to promote these sites as potential promoters of local culture and economic growth (conservation of these sites has been encouraged through SDG goals 11 and 8). Similarly, the Government of India

has also targeted to preserve and revive the heritage city through HRIDAY (Heritage City Development & Augmentation Yojana) mission

- ❖ Dr Fauzia Rehman said that transport is a fundamental part of cultural landscape. It plays a vital role in the regional development of a particular space. She described the impact, accessibility and relationship between transport and regional development of the region.
- ❖ Ved Prakash in his study tried to assess the nature of flooding and its implication among the riparian communities in the Kosi Basin of Bihar. To prepare the flood vulnerability map of the basin, Analytical Hierarchy Process (AHP) model was adopted by using 6 physical and anthropogenic factors, viz. land use/land cover, soil taxonomy, precipitation, drainage density, slope and inundated areas.
- ❖ Anju Kumari tried to analyse positive impact of ICT in expanding the higher education beyond its boundaries of traditional classrooms while taking into consideration various key indicators including socio-economic conditions, gender identity among others. It also considered various public works projects that are currently underway, as well as how government, industry, organizations, and citizens must collaborate to maximise the use of ICT in order to maximise the benefits of new technologies to all strata of society.
- ❖ Kumar Shashi Shekhar discussed about the issues and challenges of sustainable development in Samastipur. Unplanned sewage disposal of the adjoining areas have largely polluted the rivers and quality of life is very poor in the study area.

TEK provides insight into the relationship between man and nature, resource assessment and management, ethno-taxonomy, successional dynamics, sustainable harvesting, species interactions, and adaptive management and conservation.



- ❖ Dr. Seema Singh investigated that culture and traditions play an important role to transform any person, society and Nation. Real happiness comes from within and gives a sense of contentment when we close to our culture. The aim of the present research was to explore the role of cultural symbols, traditions and lok geet in happiness and well being of 100 youth (age between 18 to 35 years, 50 male and 50 female) of Kaimur district. Sequential mixed method design used for this study which is comprised with qualitative and quantitative both method in one study. PERMA scale and a semi structure interview schedule regarding cultural symbols, traditions and lok geet used as a research tool. Different themes are emerged like, importance of family, social relationship, satisfaction of basic need, inner connectedness, balance, harmony and contentment etc. Presence of cultural practices as frequently uses of Swastika symbol, blessings of 'khush raho', Chhath parve, occasional lokgeet, use of 'we' instead of 'I' nourish their positive way of daily life. Spiritual belief associated with Mundeshwari Dham, Harshu Bramah and Gupta Dham serve as a cultural therapy in building happiness and well being. Cultural activities strengthen their life skills and vital emotions to transform human beings into a blissful being who makes this world a happy planet.
- ❖ Nidhi Bhawna stressed that local religious beliefs are important and not taught through texts, but through storytelling, art, songs and rituals.
- ❖ Dr. Sunita Kumari Sinha stated that family is the unit of the social structure and the social structure is the product of all dimensions of creation and its effects. While the circumstances of the society have been changing its visible form, history is witness that the pattern and pattern of the family has also changed.
- ❖ Preety Kumari and Ritu Kumari focused to provide a detail account on historicity of modern district Buxar in the state of Bihar, in relation to its geographical features as well as the settlements pattern in different cultural phases.
- ❖ Pankaj Kumar examined one of the most notable elements of Indian society is the continuation of strong patriarchal norms on women in a variety of forms, which results in disparities in well being as well as discrepancies in power and decisive decision making.
- ❖ Prashant Kumar revealed that the people lives in rural areas depend on agriculture. This rural agriculture production and consumption process plays a predominant role in developing the Indian economy.

- ❖ Sarwat Afrin found that the non-tribal students show higher neuroticism as compared to tribal counterparts and no difference was found in extraversion.
- ❖ Rajnish Kumar discussed about the role of the non-farm sector in generating employment and reducing poverty in non-farm areas. Rural people often face drought and famines which create conditions for severe scarcity of food and fodder. This situation calls for immediate measures to create fast development of RNFS to gain full employment opportunities.
- ❖ Dr. Uday Pratap Singh through light on India's rich cultural awareness which plays a pivotal role in shaping it as a great nation. India's rich cultural heritage does not end at monuments, sculptures or collection of objects of arts, but it is a living expression of great Vedic philosophy.
- ❖ Nidhi Singh discussed about the greatest challenge before Bharat and its cultural heritage. The challenge being the propaganda and misinterpretation from the western international academia. The paper further discusses the concept of Bharat, its incredible history and vibrant culture.
- ❖ Mandeep Kumar illustrates that matrimonial cultural heritage is the inheritance of material artefacts and intangible features of the society that have been inherited from previous generation. The parents of the urban areas have followed the old tradition, matrimonial cultural living, food, arts, marriage geet, dowry free matrimonial program, social ethics.
- ❖ Nisha Kumari explored the role of emotional intelligence and culture in the conception of skilled Bharat.
- ❖ Kaushal Kumar discussed that on the Climate change affects directly and indirectly the tangible and intangible features of heritage sites and also examine the impact of climate change on heritage sites by assuming it as an isolated and static concept. He adopts the qualitative meta-synthesis method to analyse the impact of the climate change on world heritage sites through a systematic review of reports published by UNESCO and its advisory body.
- ❖ Priya Richa in her presentation talked on cultural heritage concept as the primary and neglected factor for wise development of climate-resilience policies. The findings suggest that protection of cultural heritage and developing the climate-resilience policies for the sustainability of landscape requires at the early stages a reflection on how heritage is defined as a useful resource and acceptable characteristic of territory.
- ❖ Kumari Neha and Dr. Priyadarshni K. Rashmi discussed that Eco-critical elements in the novel 'Hullabaloo in the Guava Orchard' by Kiran Desai. Ecocriticism as a theory reveals the need of

understanding on the part of human beings to develop a harmonious relationship between natural world and human nature.

- ❖ Dr. Rai P. Dhananjay in his address talked on life Containing and life supporting environment of the world is restricted to a very irregular layer around the globe. This Thin veil of living material on the earth is called ecosphere or biosphere. Thus, the biosphere is that part of earth in which life exists. But aside from these physical Threats, Climate Change will impact on social and cultural aspects, with Communities Changing the way they live, work worship and socialize in building sites and landscape, possibly migrating and abandoning Their built heritage.
- ❖ Prabhakar Pratyush in his presentation talked on deleterious effects of climate change has been causing consistent churn all around the world and also discussed that revolves around the far-reaching consequences of the Indo-US climate compact and its utilitarian value in ensuring the preservation and promotion of cultural heritages of India. In September 2021, both the countries unveiled the Climate Action and Finance Mobilization Dialogue (CAFMD), which is one among the two tracks of the Indo-US
- ❖ Kumar Abhijeet and kumar Raviranjana discussed the Climate variability affecting cultural heritage sites, as evidenced by gradual changes in temperature, precipitation, atmospheric moisture, and wind intensity, as well as sea level rise and changes in the occurrence of extreme events. There is a growing body of research on the effects of climate change on cultural heritage and the assessment of climate change impacts on cultural heritage assets. □ Srivastava Aastha in her study, talked on Climate change and its effects on heritage preservation and promotion. Also discussed about the climate change dangerous for current and future.
- ❖ Dr. Usha talked on climate change affects all areas of the processes of heritage preservation and promotion. Various changes in climate including rainfall patterns, humidity, and ambient temperature, as well as greater exposure to severe and inclement weather events, have led to the need for adaptation in cultural heritage preservation and promotion practices. However, there have been limited research projects accomplished to date on the process of adaptation of cultural heritage preservation practices in response to climate change.
- ❖ Kumari Kanchan in her presentation talked on problems of climate change due to human activities like industrialization, urbanization and deforestation.

- ❖ Priyanka in her study analysed the effect of climate change on natural and cultural heritage on contemporary india.
- ❖ Mahato N. Ram talked on climate change and cultural heritage.
- ❖ Shashi discussed about the effect of water pollution on environment of Badhra sector, Bhojpur district, Bihar.
- ❖ Satya Suman Soni briefly discussed different time frames of historical migration trends from the Aryan period.
- ❖ Dr B. P Devli explained the socio economic conditions of Bhotia during China war and their marked improvement since Article 342 notified them as Scheduled Tribes since 1967.
- ❖ Jyoti Kumari explained the growth of traditional lifestyle of Benaras into a new commercial way with modern fashion and lifestyle based on various literary sources of Nikhil Chand and Satya Vyas
- ❖ Brajesh Kumar explained different programmes running for the welfare of the scheduled castes population in Bihar namely; Pradhan Mantri Awas Yojana, Ujjwala Yojana, Lohia Swachh Bihar Abhiyan, Dashrath Manjhi Kaushal Vikas Yojana, Vikas Mitra, Mahadalit Awas Bhoomi Yojana, Mahadalit Health-Card Scheme, etc. are being implemented. "Chief Minister's Seven Determination Scheme" etc.
- ❖ Indu Prakash Mishra discussed from different ancient texts richness of Indian Cultural heritage. According to him, we must review and promote our traditional Indian education system
- ❖ Babita Kumari discussed Impact of Changing Culture on Agriculture: A Geographical Study in Dumraon subdivision. The changing culture here has had a lot of side effects on agriculture. To prevent this, there is a need to create awareness among the people and explain the importance of agriculture.
- ❖ Anupam Kumari discussed about Bhuraha as an ancient religious and cultural site in Gurua block in Gaya district of Bihar. This place is as important for Buddhists as well as Hindus. At present, it is developing as a tourist destination. The discussion of Bhuraha is found in Brahma Ramayana and other texts.
- ❖ Madan Khurana described the importance of different Buddhist sites in Gaya and the need of their conservation which are largely ignored by the national and international authorities. Some of them are Manda, Guneri, Bhurha, Devkali, Buddhni Pahad etc.
- ❖ Rohini Tiwari stressed on the role of women in cultural heritage preservation and promotion.

- ❖ Dr Ratnesh Shukla elaborated how we respect mother earth based on our vedic culture
- ❖ Dr Sonal explained how we are adopting modern way of life by emachanisation but overlooking our spiritual upliftment.
- ❖ Md Athar Imam Ansari discussed about the role of indian languages in rich cultural heritage.
- ❖ Dr Munawwar Hussain Ansari stressed on special attwention to preserve the sitres and places within 100 m radius from all sort of pollution and encroachment.
- ❖ Dr Mukesh Paswan elaborated on the condition of shudras in Indian society.

Many ancient historical and cultural heritage sites have been excavated, identified and a lot of research work is going on. He discussed about amaltas, the area Tribes of Adhaura in Kaimur and how they live isolated life from the people of the Planes. Now they are leaving their traditional way of life for the modern way of life. He elaborated on takia that is a significant important route from Kashi to Patliputra and a lot of ancient heritage sites are found in that route. There are Ashokan inscriptions in the route from Kashi to Patliputra then Sasaram. Gold coins are found in Mohanpur. He also gave reference of Hanuman Ghat and Madhu ka Tila in Kaimur where this excavations have been done. There is a rock shelter in a Adhaura along with ancient Wells. Britishers said that Indians didn't know about the iron before 1795, but there are iron pillars found in the area which are dating back to more than two thousand years. There is example of agriculture and iron around which date back 2000 of years old. Prof Tripathi in his chairman message talked about Vedic science and literature. He stated that we should work towards development of our cultural heritage by reviving our Veda and Vedic culture. He also talk about Chetna and how Dr Jagdish Chandra Bose found the sensitivity in plants responding to music and touching. We must work to enhance and awaken our inner consiousness. All of us should work in tandem with mother nature to become a better human being and make this world a place of peace and harmony.

India has a rich cultural heritage dating back to thousands of years. 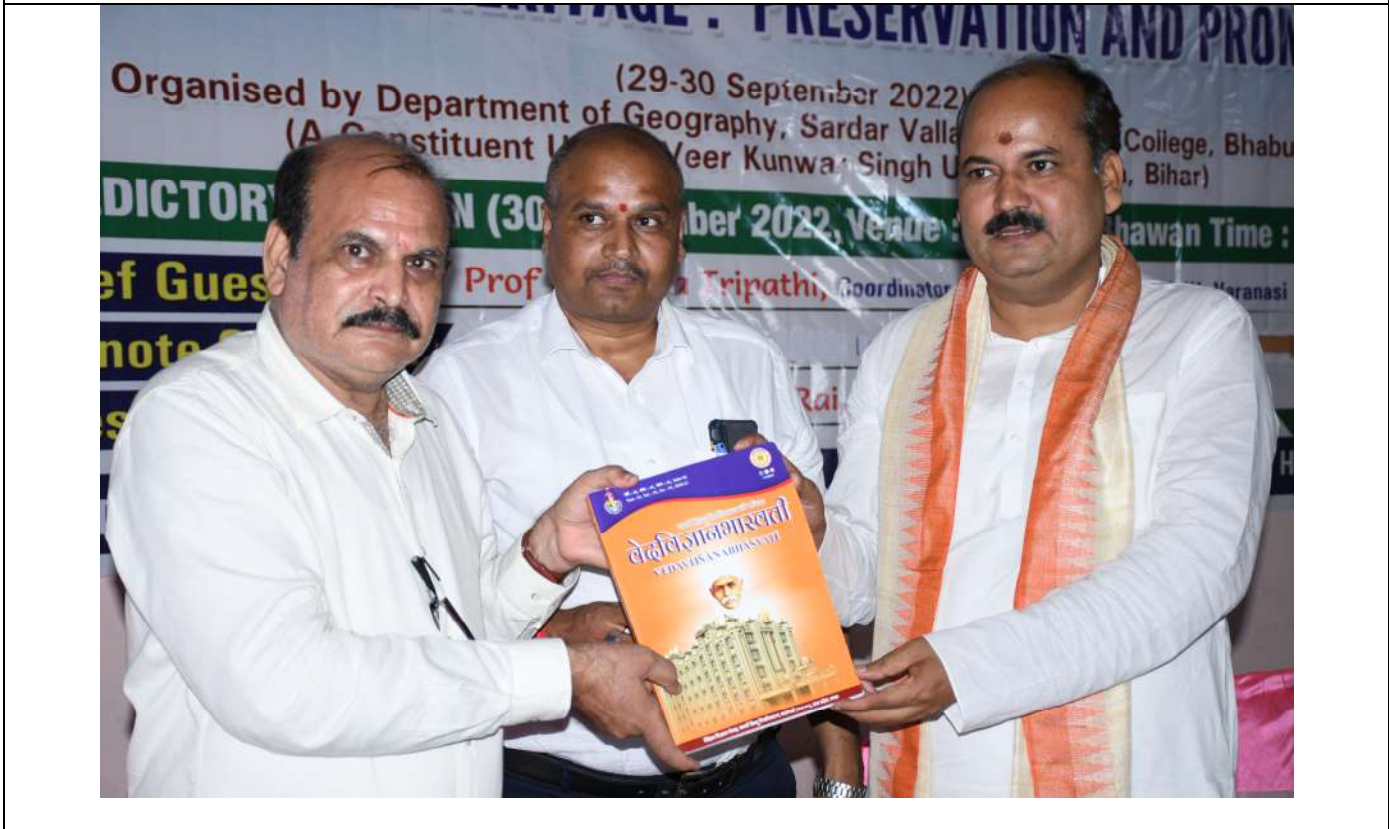




















## सेमिनार में देश व विदेश के कई विद्वान होंगे शामिल
